4.	What reasons are given for praying for government leaders? Given other passages regarding suffering as a Christian (e.g. II Tim. 3:10-12) this seems a little surprising. What can we learn from this? (See also I Thess. 4:11)
5.	How do verses 5-6 fit into this text?
6.	How do we "lift up holy hands"? (Does this mean we are to wave our hands in the air while praying?)
7.	Why should we pray "without wrath and dissension/doubting?" (Consider Prov. 15:29 and I Pet. 3:7) How could we be guilty of this?
