2.	What is the difference between the root of a plant and the fruit of a plant?
3.	There are four categories of anger: Word, Thought, Attitude, Action. What are some different examples of anger that we observe today from these categories?
4.	Is there a difference between righteous and unrighteous anger? Is it possible to be angry without sinning (Eph. 4:26)? What is the difference?
5.	Why do you think Jesus started this section of His teaching with anger? (Instead of: Lust, Divorce, Oaths, Retaliation, Loving your Enemies)
6.	In Matthew 5:23-24 what is Jesus saying is more important than sacrifice? How would the Pharisees have responded to hearing this revelation?
